## LYDIA THOMPSON

Lydia Thompson played junior rugby for Worcester RFC before joining the senior team in 2012.

She made her debut for England vs Spain in 2012 and scored a hat-trick of tries. Lydia was a member of England's World Cup winning team in 2014, scoring 2 tries against Samoa before missing the later part of the tournament because of injury.

In 2017 she helped England to win the 6 Nations Grand Slam, scoring 3 tries against Wales in Cardiff and 1 against Ireland in Dublin. She was then selected for England's World Cup squad, who eventually finished runners up to New Zealand. Lydia scored 5 tries in 4 games, including a try against New Zealand in the final in Belfast. Her performances in 2017 led to her being nominated as World Rugby Women's Player of the Year.

In 2018 Lydia focussed on sevens where she won a Bronze Medal for England in the Commonwealth Games in Australia after helping the team beat Canada 24-19 in the Bronze Medal Match.

In 2019 Lydia missed England's 6 Nations campaign through injury, but she returned to the squad for the Summer Super series in the USA and the 2020 6 Nations.
